### Communion Reflection... Mother Teresa said:

'Many today are starving for ordinary bread. But there is another kind of hunger - the hunger to be wanted, to be loved, to be recognized. Nakedness too is not just the want of clothes, but also about loss of dignity, purity, and selfrespect. And homelessness is not just a want of a house; there is the homelessness of being rejected, of being unwanted in a throwaway society. The biggest disease in the world today is the feeling of being unwanted and uncared-for. The greatest evil in the world is lack of love, the terrible indifference towards one's neighbor. Lord, warm our cold hearts with your grace, so that we your disciples may produce the fruits of love.



Meeting people we haven't seen in years usually causes us to notice how they have or have not aged. We either marvel at how little they've changed or are taken aback at the toll taken by time. Once the physical appearance

has been noted, the personality comes into focus. Is it the same person we always remembered or has life changed them for better or worse? Our Lord knows who we are no matter what our age. Each year of life is His gift to us to be used wisely. After our resurrection, God will take care of our bodily condition. We'll arise with a glorified body as He did. Our concern is the condition of the soul. Has it changed for better or worse since our youth? Fortunately, there is still some time to work on the answer. The Knights of Columbus will be hosting their



**Advent...** is a time to celebrate light in the midst of darkness, as symbolized by the Advent Wreath. The Advent Wreath represents God's love. The evergreen and the circle (wreath) symbolize that God is Eternal

and always with us. The candles represent Jesus, the Light of the World... the ONE Light that dispels darkness. The four Advent candles are lit for each of the four Advent Sundays. Advent is traditionally considered a season of penitence and fasting, to prepare for Christmas, and its liturgical colour is purple - the three purple candles reflect this and also the sorrow we feel for not loving Jesus enough. The rose candle is lit on the 3rd Sunday (Gaudete Sunday) in joyful anticipation of Christmas. Some Advent Wreaths have a white candle in the centre - This candle represents Christ and is lit on Christmas Day. During Advent, children will be chosen from those who come extra early for Mass on Sat./Sun to come up in procession to light the wreath.

Jesus Christ, we say, is our "King." Is this **PASTOR** title "King" merely an honorary figurative one accorded Jesus Christ by His Church? The Gospels dispel any such idea. The

Annunciation, Nativity, Epiphany - all attest to Christ's Kingship. He often spoke of the practices and problems of kings. His miracles attest to His power, His laws, His authority; and His Church attests to His leadership. He entered Jerusalem in triumph as King. He was robed, crowned, sceptered, hailed, proclaimed, condemned and crucified as a King, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews." He admitted to Pilate that He is a King. His Kingship is a common Gospel theme. Jesus Christ is King, and all people, Christian or not, are His subjects. As His subjects, we must keep His commandments to love God and our neighbour. "If you love Me, keep My Commandments." He will judge us, He told us, on the basis of our love of neighbour. We must not only avoid harming our neighbour, we must support them in times of stress and temptation, comfort them in sorrow, relieve their distress, treat them kindly, share our joys and theirs. And we must help them keep God's Commandments. On Dec 11, 1925, Pope Pius XI established the annual feast of Christ the King to combat secularism. The Church now celebrates the feast on the Sunday before Advent (today). This feast provides us with a splendid opportunity to proclaim publicly the social rights of Christ Our King.

During the month of November, we take the time to pause and remember those who have died and await the resurrection of the body at the end of time, especially those in



our parish cemeteries. "May the Lord grant eternal rest to them and send his comfort and strength to us, the living, as we look forward to our reunion, one day, in the glory of God's eternal kingdom in heaven."

Envelopes for All Souls are available at the back of the Church and may be placed in front of the Altar for the month of November. The names will be remembered at the Masses during the year, along with candles at the altar. All donations will be used for Masses, Memorial Candles, and Sanctuary improvements.
