

**Communion Reflection...** Jane loves to babysit her grandson Alex. One day Jane and Alex made swords out of aluminum foil. Jane grabbed the fake sword and shouted, "Let's head for the basement and the monster behind the door." Alex led the way. At the door, he turned to Jane and said, "Nana, I got a great idea. You go first." We all have crosses that Jesus asks us to actively embrace, to take up, not just to passively accept and then to follow him in hope. He has gone first. He leads us and shows us how to suffer. We end each Mass with a Sign of the Cross; we enter a church or begin our prayer with the same sign. May the cross be a reminder to follow our leader. Think about the crosses you have carried and how they were blessings in disguise. O God, I know that you are always with me, in times of joy and in times of sorrow. Increase my hope, knowing that you have gone before me when I felt alone in my pain and in my worry.



The great hope of a well-lived Christian astor life is not "heaven eventually and if we're good enough." God's promise of eternal life is not for the holy and perfect few

who have their lives together. Rather, the hope of forgiveness and life is for those who are weak and know it. Our hope stems from a God who loves us so much that he loved us while we were still wallowing in our sins, while we lived with no sense what we even needed God. God's love always comes first. God, patiently and with unfathomable love, waits for us to turn to him and say, "I can't do this on my own." Are there sins you are hiding from God what you have not confessed? God, may the only perfection I seek be my perfect desire for your healing and grace, knowing that all else is foolishness and vanity.

#### **Prayer of Consecration to the Sacred Heart**

Most sweet Jesus, redeemer of the human race, look down upon us, humbly prostrate before your altar. Be you king of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbor of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd. Be you king also of all those who sit in the ancient superstition of the Gentiles, and refuse not you to deliver them out of darkness into the light and kingdom of God. Grant, O Lord, to your Church, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the divine heart that wrought our salvation; to it be glory and honour forever.
