Communion Reflection... Parents do it. So do teachers, bosses, pastors. In every grouping, somebody carries ultimate responsibility. The buck stops with them. They're the last court of appeal. It's not easy sitting in that chair. The weight of the welfare of others bears down on the one who wields authority. In faith, the pope isn't really the highest authority. Even he must bow before the God who is all in all. The one who occupies Peter's Chair has to entrust his discernment to the power of the Holy Spirit, and to disciplines of prayer, the wisdom of consulters, and the wealth of church tradition. You and I might consider how we utilize the authority we possess. We have the power to vote and to make our voices heard. We control the wallop of the wallet. Perhaps most importantly, we have the crucial influence of our example before those who know us every hour. How do you use the clout of your example to make the world a more compassionate place?



From the Pastor's Desk Defending the Christians before the Emperor Hadrian, Aristides, a non-Christian, said of them: 'These

Christians love one another, they never fail to help widows. They save orphans from those who would hurt them. If a man has something, he gives freely to the man who has nothing. If they see a stranger, Christians take him into their homes and treat him as a brother. And if they hear that one of them is in jail, or persecuted for professing the name of their redeemer, they all give him what he needs. If it is possible, they bail him out. If one of them is poor and there isn't enough food to go around, they fast several days to give him the food he needs. We are dealing with a new kind of person. There is something divine in them.'



Feast of the Divine Mercy


