Communion Reflection... Jesus said that there are two roads we can follow. The first is wide and easy to travel. It is downhill most of the way. It is the way of comfort and ease, pleasure and self-seeking. Many are fooled and travel down this road. But in the long run it leads them nowhere. They die in the desert. The second road is narrow and difficult. It is uphill a lot of the way. It is the way of struggle and sacrifice. Few take this road. But they are the lucky ones. This road leads to the Promised Land.



Pride and humility are two major realities of life that we will probably never be finished with as

long as we are walking the face of this earth. Pride means living in illusion, and humility means living in the truth. And living in the truth is the real goal of our lives. Some people actually are smarter, more talented, better looking, thinner, richer, wittier than others. That's how life is. But when we use our intelligence, or talents, or looks, as a way of putting others down, then pride has moved into our lives. Humility acknowledges the existence of the gifts we have all received, but behind humility is an attitude of gratefulness to God for everything we have received. Pride causes so much harm because it puts barriers between people. Pride leads to comparisons, which almost always lead to placing one person in a higher or lower position than others. Humility demands that we seriously listen to the thoughts and opinions of others. Pride closes us in on ourselves. Humility opens us up to God and to others.

To be authentic disciples and stewards, we must heed the words of St. Paul to the Hebrews and be willing to subject ourselves to the discipline of the Lord. We must strive to be humble like Jesus, gladly taking up our cross and following him. Let us not walk the path that is broad and smooth, with many comforts and luxuries along the way, for this is the path that leads to destruction. Rather, let us strive to be like the saints and walk the narrow path, which is hard and difficult but leads to life everlasting with the Lord. As stewards, we are called to give of ourselves and to be willing to travel this narrow path. One way to do this is through sacrifice and fasting. Let us take up the practice this week of offering some comfort up to the Lord so that we can better orient ourselves to the narrow path of life.

Are we Blessed or Lucky!

No matter what happens to us...we are lucky. We are lucky to be alive...to have problems and challenges... to have strengths and weaknesses... people who love us... a roof over our heads...our health. Take care of what you've got. Focus on the positive. Know that you are very, very fortunate, and things could indeed, be much worse! Therefore, treat yourself as a lucky person today and every day. Blessed=Lucky

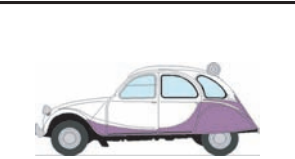
