



Communion Reflection... If we want to know how we are to respond to God's call to intimate relationship, it begins by following the model of Mary's simple "yes." What that means will vary from person to person, based on the circumstances of life. But the Annunciation to Mary makes it clear that we will be called to go outside of our comfort zones. It probably won't be so dramatic as what happened to Mary, but even small changes can sometimes seem uncomfortable to us. For what tasks have you come to realize that you are called to say "yes" to the Lord, yet the tasks still seem so challenging? In what ways are your own fears and attachments keeping you from a closer relationship with Christ? And, once you identify these, will you pray for the grace to say, "Let it be with me according to your word?"



Few things put a smile of our faces faster than a smiling, laughing baby. The purity and innocent joy of a child is truly infectious. Maybe this is the reason why

God decided not to appear to us first as a full-grown adult, but rather as a baby. There is a comfort and peace when looking into a baby's face. It is a very different experience when we've done something wrong. Do I really see God in the infant in the manger, or do I see God as a scolding authority figure? God doesn't want us to be afraid of him; he just wants to love us. Let us look into the face of God this Christmas and see his love and mercy. Please pray for peace and especially the people of Ukraine; join us in saying a Hail Mary every day.
