Communion Reflection... When a young man was hired as a farmhand, he told the farmer, "I can sleep through a storm." One night, the farmer was awakened by a violent storm. Calling for his new farmhand, he found him sleeping soundly. So the farmer quickly began to check to see if everything was secure: the shutters were tightly fastened; a supply of logs was next to the fireplace; bales of wheat were bound and wrapped; the barn was locked tight; the animals were calm with plenty of feed. The young man's words came back to the farmer, "I can sleep through a storm." Because the farmhand worked faithfully when the skies were clear, he was prepared for any storm. When a storm did actually break, he was not concerned or afraid. He could sleep in peace. How do we prepare the world for the presence of God? Do we do that only in the difficult times or are our trusting prayers and actions embedded in our very way of living-in the serene times as well as the stormy times? Watch your actions and thoughts today. Which ones pave the way for others to recognize and welcome the presence of God?
