**Communion Reflection...** We have all lost people last year. Whether we have lost our loved ones, or we talk with others who are experiencing loss, it is hard. It is awful. But it is good to imagine however, after all of our labours and suffering, Jesus calling us home to rest. On the advice of a friend, I often pray at sunset, or in the early evening when the stars first come out, for those who have died. As we wind down the day, it is comforting to think of loved ones coming to Jesus, getting the rest only he can give. This week, pray for those who have died whenever you can during the day, but especially at sunset. Feel the consolation of the Lord in your heart. Gather photos of loved ones who have died into a place of honour. This evening, light a candle, pray together, and share memories.



When your kids ignore you (and they all do at some point), you try everything to get them to listen. You enlist other people-teachers, role models, coaches-to reinforce your messages.

And still you can feel they aren't listening. Jesus knows how you feel. He's tried sad songs (dirges) and happy flutes-and people ignored him. God sent John the Baptist to talk, and people complained about his methods. He send Jesus, and people got caught up in how the message was delivered that they forgot to listen to the message itself. The next time you sigh loudly because your kids aren't listening, just stop and listen yourself. What is Jesus saying to you? Take a listening walk together. Alternate between listening and reporting the sounds you hear. For example, you might stay silent for one block and share what you hear on the next block.

The Baptism of Jesus... is the first of the Five Luminous Mysteries. John the Baptist and Jesus were relatives. John's mother, Elizabeth, knew from the very beginning. before Jesus was born, that Mary was going to be the mother of God. John had a mission to prepare the people for the coming of Christ,

and he was fulfilling his mission. He had been baptizing at the Jordan River when one day, Jesus came and asked John to baptize him. John protested, saying Jesus should be the one baptizing him, but Jesus told John he needed to do this to fulfill all righteousness. So John baptized Jesus in the river. Immediately after he was baptized, as he was praying, the heavens opened and a dove came down and rested on Jesus. It was the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove who showed Jesus his favour from God. Suddenly, a voice from heaven said, "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Jesus' divinity is revealed by God the Father himself. Later, when John was assembled with a group, he told them what happened. He told the group he'd seen the Spirit of God coming down on Jesus in the form of a dove. As Jesus approached them, John said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" While we receive the sacrament of baptism to receive the saving grace and Holy Spirit, Jesus was born without sin and therefore was baptized for another reason. His baptism was his acceptance of his mission as our suffering servant, the Lamb of God, destined to suffer and die on the cross for our sins. In doing this, Jesus overcomes the power of death and rises, bringing us to new life. A wonderful way to end the Christmas season!
