Communion Reflection... It is difficult for us to put into words the true meaning of Jesus' passion and death on the cross. The truth is, we cannot fully comprehend such sacrifice. We could say that Jesus gave the only thing he had: his very life. And of course, it is everything. Through Jesus' self-gift, we are drawn to the very heart of God. We are offered reconciliation, salvation, and peace. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross does not end in death but in victory-resurrection and new life. Through Christ's sacrifice, we are shown the depths of God's love and are invited to share in it. Christ's death and resurrection give meaning to the small and not-so-small sacrifices you make in the course of your life: time given when you feel like you have nothing left within yourself; attention to children and elders; service and companionship with the poor, lonely, and ill; money even when it means not having the new thing you have had your eye on. When you give yourself, you truly embrace Christ's cross and resurrection.



Most of us have to deal with a dizzy array of "oughts" and "musts" in our life which may leave us feeling guilty for falling short of others' expectations. Of course, we do fall hopelessly short of

obeying God's commands. How can we have a pure heart that can see God? Our heart will never be perfectly pure on this side of eternity. But Jesus has done the impossible for us. He has purified our hearts by his blood, shed on the cross, which cleanses us from all sin. A pure heart has been sprinkled clean by our baptism. A pure heart holds fast to the confession of our hope in Christ without wavering. A pure heart spurs others on to a life of love and good deeds. And a pure heart encourages others in the faith, as we see the Day approaching when we will see our Saviour face-to-face.

All of us go through periods of doubt. We're living by faith, not by sight, after Dastor all. But left unchecked, doubting eventually turns to cynicism. True

doubting always seeks an answer. Cynicism couldn't care less about finding an answer because cynicism is full-blown unbelief. Prior to their confirmation, a group of students were told by their pastor, "During your life in Christ, you'll have questions, lots of them. Don't hold them in. Ask your questions. Just make sure you want to know the answers when you do ask." Jesus never commends doubt, but when we go through periods of doubt, he will work us out of it. He worked through Thomas' materialism. Thomas wanted to see Jesus in the flesh, but Jesus let him know that those who have not seen and still believe are blessed. Jesus also worked the disciples out of their ghost-believing ways, showing them his flesh and bone hands and feet and eating fish before them. The one thread that ties Thomas and the other disciples together is that in their doubt, they sought the answer.

Take Time

Take time to laugh - It is the music of the soul. Take time to think - It is the source of power. Take time to play - It is the source of perpetual youth. Take time to read - It is the fountain of wisdom. Take time to pray - It is the greatest power on earth. Take time to love and be loved - It is a God given privilege. Take time to be a friend - It is the road to happiness. Take time to give - It is too short a day to be selfish.

Teacher Candidates... The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board requires all teacher

applicants to submit a pastoral portfolio/reference



when applying for a teaching position. It is the responsibility of the candidate to attend Sunday liturgy, be involved in parish life and contact the parish priest well in advance. Teacher candidates who are attending school out of the local area are also responsible to give the pastor advance notice. The pastor cannot complete the form if he does not know the applicant.
