**Communion Reflection...** A preschool aged boy was eating an apple in the back seat of the car. "Daddy," he said, "why is my apple turning brown?" The boys father explained, "Because after you ate the skin off, the meat of the apple came in contact with the air, which caused it to oxidize, thus changing its molecular structure and turning it into a different colour." There was a long silence, and then the boy asked, "Daddy, are you talking to me?" Jesus is talking to us. Thankfully, he speaks in a language that we can understand. Jesus keeps it simple. Do you want to know how to live in this world? Simple: treat others as you wish to be treated. Who can't understand that? Unfortunately, we often live as if those words were incomprehensible. They are not. Keep life simple; do unto others as you would have them do unto you.
