

Communion Reflection... On Mount Sinai, Moses received God's Law and then taught that law to the people of Israel. The people trembled in fear as they came to meet God at the mountain, so Moses was the mediator through whom they received God's commands. Grace, God's undeserved favour for sinners, was shown to us on Mount Calvary. There, the Son of God, the mediator of grace, was lifted up on a cross. Jesus took onto himself all of our transgressions against God's law. He suffered the penalty of death that we deserved for our sins. We meet God at the cross, but we do not tremble in fear because, "we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand."



One of the wonders of our faith is our heavenly Father's unlimited acceptance of us, no matter how badly we may have disappointed him, messed up our life or hurt others. Having been freed from the consequences we deserve for our countless

transgressions by Christ's redeeming sacrifice on the cross, we can't help but marvel at the all-encompassing love with which God embraces us. We are his beloved children-no matter what. As we grow in faith and experience more and more of God's unlimited acceptance, we eagerly follow his road of sacrificial service, no matter how challenging it may look, knowing that our heavenly father will always be there for us, not matter what. Forgiving God, we are eternally grateful that we can count on you to be with us always, for Jesus' sake. Amen.

It's easy to get our attention these days. One little beep on our devices, a slight vibrations of our phones and we're like the frog catching a fly: he hears a buzz and wham!- he catches it. We're told to keep up and we're desperate to do that-through the news feeds, the tweets, the pings for an

email. It's exhausting and we're losing. We can't keep up-we weren't designed to know and care about everything. Most of us have never fasted, except to shed a few pounds, but one thing we know about it is that it hurts. So, why would Jesus talk about it? Because fasting does several important things for a distracted human being: it gets our attention, reminding us that we can't generate our own food and that our Heavenly Father supplies it, which generates thanksgiving. Because fasting hurts, it draws us closer to Jesus, who hurt in every way possible. When we read the Passion accounts in a few weeks, all we see is hurt. Our Lord hurt, but not for his sake-for ours. It's called mercy. And God's mercy always supplies our every need.
