Communion Reflection... When I was little, some members of the family were more welcome than others. Some neighbours were favoured and others disdained. Even Catholics in town were ranked according to ethnicity and presumed stereotypes. It seemed acceptable to reject people based on who they were or the choices they made. But it felt wrong. Jesus claims a tax collector as a disciple. He follows this up by dining at a house full of undesirables. This can be a little confusing to anybody who still thinks it's okay to write certain people off. Jesus meets Levi at his post, so there's no question that Jesus knows what Levi does for a living. He's a traitor, lining the pocket for his efforts on behalf of the Romans. Obviously he's a bad guy. Who would welcome him? Jesus does. He likewise accepts the hospitality of this villain. As a result, Levi flips and joins the Jesus team. He even becomes the evangelist Matthew. What a strategy! No one can be transformed by love when they're outside the circle of its embrace.



Life is busy–and fun! We might be studying and going to school. We're working. We're cleaning and gardening and fixing things. But sometimes, we need a break from the busy. We need quiet and thinking time. What a relief it is to just be by ourselves outdoors

or inside our room–walking or sitting in the quiet–just us and God. Jesus leads the way for us, right here in Lent. At the beginning of his earthly public journey of loving and sharing, Jesus took forty days alone in the desert, where he fasted and prayed. We can't grow closer to the Lord until we start being honest about who we are right now. So, we take some quiet time in Lent to be honest with God about ourselves–the good and the bad, the weak and the strong. **Stations of the cross are able to be viewed on our YouTube channel.** Unfortunately at this time, we are not able to hold in person Stations of the Cross.



Prayer for the 4th Sunday of Lent



St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep.

Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. A few years after returning home, Patrick had a vision that prompted his studies for the priesthood. Patrick arrived in Slane, Ireland on March 25, 433. He preached and built churches across the country. He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died on March 17, 461. Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, whose love and total devotion to and trust in God should be a shining example to each of us.
