Communion Reflection... As Jesus began his journey to the cross by entering Jerusalem, "his disciples did not understand these things at first" (John 12:16). Later that week, they puzzled again at the Passover meal when Jesus washed their feet. Peter even tried to stop Jesus. That's when Jesus answered Peter with the words "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." (John 13:7). How often we have all said, "I don't understand!" while pouring out fears, worries, and burdens in prayer. Like the disciples, we must believe Jesus' promise that one day we will understand. Later on, the disciples did come to understand what Jesus had done during Holy Week and his entire earthly ministry. Sometimes we, too, must wait, relying on the Spirit, the Word and God's timing for the day we can say, "Now I understand!"
