



Communion Reflection... A neighbour said he'd been raised with nine siblings. I said, "You must've gotten lost in the shuffle!" "We had ways of getting their attention!" He replied with a smile. We have our own ways of getting Jesus' attention. The lepers shouted at him, "Over here!" The long-ill woman was quieter and just touched his robe. Peter bragged to Jesus about all the things he'd do. One thread that runs through the gospels is that Jesus seemed to know those he encountered before he encountered them. The disciples were known prior to their calls. The woman at the well was know before she came for water. Jesus knew the thief before he uttered his plea. But sometimes we don't want Jesus' attention. We've disgraced ourselves and are ashamed. Peter was like that. Jesus gave him his full attention by ridding him of his disgrace. The reality is that we don't need to shout to get Jesus' attention. We have it already.



Is there a solid love out there, one that doesn't lose shape when the heat's on? What kind of love makes an unwanted orphan into an heir of the treasury of the

kingdom of God? What kind of love covers a disgraced son or daughter with robes befitting a prince or princess?
