
October is the Month of the Rosary...

Communion Reflection... We love each other, but living, learning and working with other people can be hard. We're all so different! We hurt each other. We make mistakes. We ignore each other. We're selfish. It sometimes seems easier to try to ignore that hurt, but Jesus tells us that we can't do that. It's our whole heart we're bringing to him, honest and true. No secrets. No hidden anger. When we take time every day to be honest about our sins before God, it's not just about us alone. We bring our weakness to the Lord every day, and we try, too, to make a habit of making peace with those we've wronged, be reconciled and, as St. Paul tells us elsewhere, to not even "let the sun go down on our anger."



From the Dastor What a mystery we are! We're funny and serious. We can be brave but still get scared sometimes. We understand some things but are puzzled by others. We can give generously but still be selfish at times. That's all of us. Each person is a gift. Each person is made by

God and made for life with him forever. The pull to go the other way, toward darkness and selfishness, is strong and will last your whole life-ask any adult! That's why it's so important to keep our eyes on Jesus, let him be our guide and our strength, and form simple habits that help us keep that focus on knowing and accepting who we really are. So, every day we thank God for making us, we celebrate his goodness in us, and we admit our sins. We trust that the Lord will help us grow and walk steadily toward him with our whole hearts-because we are his children. That is who we are. Let us pray: Loving father, thank you for making me. 
