Communion Reflection... When we forgive we free ourselves of the burden of bitterness, and we free the other person of the burden of guilt. But our forgiveness must come from the heart, which means it must be true, sincere, and warm. A cold forgiveness is not much use. Forgiveness should start now. Putting it off only deepens the wound, prolongs bitterness, and postpones happiness. Life is short, time is fleeting. Today is the day to forgive. Lord, deliver us from the poison of bitterness, and give us the grace to forgive from the heart those who have offended us. Then we will know the warmth of your forgiveness.



Every life story contains an incident or two when we said something we shouldn't have or failed to say something when we should. For the most part, no great harm was done. There are times,

however, when someone's feelings were hurt or great embarrassment was suffered by an innocent person. The situation is even more unfortunate when we never had a chance to apologize or undo the damage we caused. Our Lord's Passion is filled with incidents of words left unsaid or spoken words that never should have been uttered. The crucifixion was the tragic result. We know that Our Lord returned and forgave those followers who didn't support Him. Thanks to Christ's Resurrection, we will all arise one day and see those we've loved and maybe hurt during our lifetime. Until then, Christ knows how sorry we are for our misspoken words. Those we've hurt probably also know our regrets. The best we can do now is to avoid adding to them by watching what we say today.
