Communion Reflection... Imagine if you didn't know the alphabet or basic math facts. How hard would it be to work every word or problem out from the beginning, every time. Even our bodies have memories, don't they? If you play an instrument or sport, you know with practice your fingers and legs learn what to do. We don't ever start from scratch with God. He dwells with us, he's speaking to us. But we are learning how to listen and grow with him. We can get into the good habit of praying, our hearts don't always have to search for the words - they're already there.



The major part of a priest's life is given to a strange "work" - liturgy. The word means "public work of performance." Laypersons think of work as something they do to make a living and stay alive, care for their families, find meaning, and achieve a modicum of success. Some justify their lives by it. The priest gives up this source of meaning and transfers it to "soul work." The work of the priest is liturgy. We could discover from the example of the priest that there is a place for an odd kind of work that feeds the soul but not necessarily the body. A few moments with a painting, a sunset, a sonata, nothing-might give the soul its sustenance, its meaning, and its reason of existence.

What is the problem with consumerism? It's not in shopping, buying, having, owning, selling or enjoying. All these are ways of being attached to the world of objects—not a bad thing in itself. The problem is that in shopping, buying, and possessing we are never satisfied, and that the feeling of emptiness after such an effort to possess indicates that for all our buying we never fully possess or fully own. I suspect that the souls needs to have and to own, and these needs are perhaps the shadow of spiritual self-denial. Monks take a vow of poverty, however, that may have nothing to do with this moralistic denial of pleasure. What does it take to really own and possess? It means loving a thing so much that one can't be parted from it, can't stand to see it neglected and misused, can't trust that someone else will care for it sufficiently. Our materialism is a sign that we don't love the world nearly enough.

Sept. 16 - Feast of St.

Cornelius Pope & Martyr. St. Cornelius was elected Pope in 251 AD during the persecutions of the Emperor Decius. His first challenge, besides the ever present threat of the Roman authorities, was to bring an end to the schism brought on by his rival, the first anti-pope Novatian. He convened a

synod of bishops to confirm him as the rightful successor of Peter. The great controversy that arose as a result of the Decian persecution was whether or not the Church could pardon and receive back into the Church those who had apostacized (denied their faith) in the face of martyrdom. Against both the bishops who argued that the Church could not welcome back apostates, and those who argued that they should be welcomed back but did not demand a heavy penance of the penitent, Cornelius decreed that they must be welcomed back and insisted that they perform an adequate penance. In 253 AD Cornelius was exiled by the emperor Gallus and died of the hardships he endured in exile. He is venerated as a martyr.
